Southland travel presents a hosted journey in Ireland in partnership with Royal Irish Tours

June 18, 2027 - Windsor - Toronto - Dublin

This afternoon, we will complete our local pickups before departing for Toronto to begin our journey to Ireland. Upon arrival at Toronto Pearson Airport, we will proceed through check-in and security, then board our flight together as a group. We will be flying with Air Canada tonight, departing Toronto at 8:50 pm (see flight details below).

June 19, 2027- Dublin - Wexford

This morning we arrive in Dublin at 8:15 am. Once we get out of the airport we will hop on the motorcoach to take a short drive into the lush landscapes of County Wicklow, known as the “Garden of Ireland.” Our first stop is in Redcross, where we’ll enjoy a hearty lunch and refreshments in an iconic Irish pub, offering a warm introduction to the country’s renowned hospitality. Afterward, we journey south along the scenic coastline to Wexford, a charming town rich in maritime history and culture. Take time to settle in and enjoy the tranquil surroundings of our hotel, set on the banks of the River Slaney. (L, D - Ferrycarrig Hotel, Wexford)



June 20, 2027 - Dunbrody & Cork

Step back in time this morning as we visit New Ross to board a replica of the Dunbrody Famine Ship. This immersive experience highlights the harrowing journeys of Irish emigrants during the Great Famine, offering a poignant start to the day. From there, we’ll head westward, making a stop at the Marine Bar for a lively music session and the chance to enjoy some traditional Irish tunes. The day concludes as we arrive in Cork, Ireland’s “Rebel City,” where you can explore its bustling streets and soak in the vibrant atmosphere. (B - Metropole Hotel, Cork)

June 21, 2027 - Cobh

This morning begins with a trip to the historic harbour town of Cobh, where the ill-fated Titanic made its last port of call. At the Titanic Experience, located in the original White Star Line ticket office, we'll take a guided tour that brings the passengers' stories to life. Afterward, you'll have some time to stroll along Cobh's picturesque promenade, dotted with brightly coloured houses, or grab lunch at one of its inviting cafés. Returning to Cork, the afternoon is yours to explore—perhaps visit the English Market, one of the oldest food markets in Europe, or relax by the River Lee. (B, D - Metropole Hotel Cork)



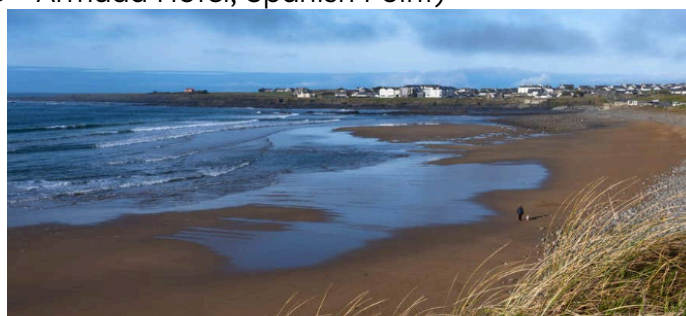
June 22, 2027 - Killarney, Kenmare & Dingle

We bid farewell to Cork and head into County Kerry, making our first stop in the postcard-perfect town of Kenmare, known for its colourful streets and artisan shops. From there, we journey through Moll's Gap, a stunning mountain pass, and admire the views of the Lakes of Killarney. After free time to explore Killarney, a town brimming with charm and local culture, we travel on to the lively fishing port of Dingle. Famous for its warm hospitality and fresh seafood, Dingle is the perfect spot to unwind and savour a delicious meal with a view of the Atlantic. (B - Dingle Skellig Hotel, Dingle)



June 23, 2027 - Cliffs of Moher

We start the day in Tralee, known for its famous Rose of Tralee festival, before continuing to the picturesque village of Adare. Wander through its charming streets, lined with thatched cottages and enjoy the unique charm of this historic village. From there, we head to Doolin for an unforgettable cruise along the base of the Cliffs of Moher. The towering cliffs, rising 700 feet above the Atlantic Ocean, are a sight to behold from the water. Capture the breathtaking views and immerse yourself in the majesty of this natural wonder before settling into our hotel for the evening. (B, D - Armada Hotel, Spanish Point)



June 24, 2027 - Burren & Kilbeggan

Today's journey takes us through the Burren, a unique limestone landscape known for its wildflowers and ancient archaeological sites. As we traverse the midlands, we make a stop at Kilbeggan Distillery, the oldest licensed distillery in Ireland. Here, we'll enjoy a guided tour that delves into the history and craftsmanship of Irish whiskey, followed by a tasting of their signature spirits. This evening, we gather for a memorable dinner at Taylors Three Rock, featuring a rousing performance of traditional Irish music and dance. (B, D - Camden Court Hotel, Dublin)



June 25, 2027 - Dublin

Spend the day discovering the best of Dublin with your Hop On/Hop Off pass, which gives you the freedom to explore at your own pace. Visit iconic landmarks such as Trinity College, home to the Book of Kells, or stroll through the lush greenery of St. Stephen's Green. Take in the lively shopping districts or enjoy a pint at a traditional pub. The evening is free to explore the vibrant streets, dine in world-class restaurants, or simply soak up the lively atmosphere of the capital city. (B - Camden Court Hotel, Dublin)

June 26, 2027 - Dublin - Toronto - Windsor

Your tour concludes this morning. Breakfast arrangements will vary based on your departure time. We will make our way back to the airport and land in Toronto at 11:55am. We will then board the motorcoach back to Windsor/Essex! (B)

Air Canada Baggage Information

Baggage Allowance per person:

1 personal item (stored under the seat in front of you)

1 carry-on (stored in the overhead bin)

1 checked bag

although all these bags are allowed we recommend bringing a checked bag and a personal item

Below you will see the dimensions and weight restrictions for each piece of baggage.

dimensions include wheels and handles

Personal Item: 33 cm (13 in) in height, 16 cm (6 in) in depth, and 43 cm (17 in) in width.

Carry On: 55 cm (21.5 in) in height, 23 cm (9 in) in depth, and 40 cm (15.5 in) in width.

Although no weight limit applies to carry-on baggage, your bag must be light enough that you can store it in the overhead bin unassisted.

If you travel with liquids or gels in containers over 100mL/100g (3.4oz) in your carry-on baggage you will have these items confiscated at the security checkpoint. Do not put any cosmetic products with aerosol in your carry on or personal item. They may be stored in your checked luggage

You are allowed to bring food on board. It must be wrapped or in a container.
You cannot consume your own alcoholic beverages on board.

Always place the following items in your carry-on bag: laptop/computer, car and house keys, medication, cash, high value items such as cameras, jewellery and electronic devices.

Travelling with Medication? Make sure it is kept in the original labelled containers. Store it in your carry on/personal item.

Checked: Maximum weight is 50lb (23kg)

The maximum linear dimensions of a piece of baggage are calculated by adding together its greatest outside height, width and length – wheels and handles included. 158 cm (62 inches)

You may store any liquids or gels over 100ml in your checked luggage.

Attach identification tags to the outside of your bags.

Make sure to remove old airline tags from all your bags.

Make sure to bring a converter plug so you can charge your devices
